

## **Grounds For Involuntary Termination**

A client may be discharged due to concerns their behavior poses to other clients or staff. In these cases, the therapist and supervisor / collaborator will discuss the concerns and attempt to rectify the situation with the client. In some cases, a safety plan may be developed. In other cases a referral to a higher level of care might be appropriate. The Director of Counseling and/or legal counsel might be part of these discussions. Clients will be notified of decisions to discharge. A formal letter will be sent to the client documenting the decision. The letter will include contact information for the State Grievance office at the Behavioral Health Certification Section.

### **Other reasons for discharge might include:**

1. Non-payment for services.
2. Two or more late cancellations.
3. Two or more no shows.
4. Non-compliance with treatment plan.
